ABSTRACT

Title: Beyond outcomes monitoring: Analysing public budget to support CRPD implementation and inclusive SDGs

Abstract text (limited to 300 words, should include background, methods, results and conclusions):

With the adoption of fairly inclusive Agenda 2030, there are many opportunities for synergies between SDGs and CRPD monitoring. While significant efforts are rightfully put on outcome indicators and disaggregation of available data as well as on legal framework analysis, little attention has been paid to current use and future need for public resources as well as broader public finance management impact on both the implementation of the CRPD and making SDGs inclusive.

The paper will present the findings and lessons learned from the 3 years CRPD compliant budget advocacy initiative led by IDA together with DPOs from India (Equals), Philippines (Philippines coalition for the CRPD) and Pacific (Pacific Disability Forum). It will address the issues of transparency and access to data, level and efficiency of spending as well as challenges with regards to costing and financing implementation of the CRPD and setting international benchmark. Attention will be paid to analysis of budget earmarking approach and issues related to public procurement. Finally, it will review the challenges and opportunities faced by DPOs in engaging in this much needed work to draw lesson for future support to advocacy for implementation of CRPD and inclusive SDGs.
